**4. New Business/Carry Forward Business**

a. Amendment to By-law #8 Dog By-law (Second Reading)

CAO introduced Second Reading of Dog By-law, including comments regarding:

- If deemed fierce or dangerous, dog must be muzzled, harnessed and leashed when off owner's property.
- When walking more than one dog, must be fully responsible, as well as physically capable to handle and control dogs at all times and if considered fierce or dangerous must be muzzled as well, anytime they are not on owner's property.
- If on own property there must be electric fence or tethered harness for fierce or dangerous dog to ensure that dog(s) cannot leave property.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

**Town of Mulgrave Council accept Second Reading of Amendment to By-law #8 Dog By-law with changes noted as per discussion. The Amended By-law #8 Dog By-law is duly passed by the Council of the Town of Mulgrave.**

b. Amendment to By-law #16 Fire Prevention By-law ( Second Reading)

CAO introduced Second Reading of Fire Prevention By-law, including comments regarding:

- Definition of Acceptable Fire Pit- brick, concrete block, heavy gauge metal, stone, with spark arrestor or metal mesh screen.
- Outdoor Fires are permitted in gas or propane appliances (considered equivalent to barbeques).
- Responsible adult who is not intoxicated or under the influence of any substance must be present on the property.

A lengthy discussion ensued regarding the need for residents to burn "Garden and Yard Waste" and the possibility of continuing to use Burning Permits for that specific use. The Mulgrave Volunteer Fire Department will discuss and make recommendations to Council for a revised Amendment.
